International humanitarian law is a body of rules governing relations between States, applicable during situations of armed conflict and occupation. As a set of rules and principles, it aims for humanitarian reasons to limit the effects of armed conflict. It protects people who are not or are no longer participating in hostilities and restricts the means and methods of warfare.

The birth of International humanitarian law was in 1864, with the adoption of the First Geneva Convention though there were rules protecting certain categories of victims in armed conflicts and customs concerning the means and methods of authorized or prohibited combat during hostilities as early as 1000 BC. Although these ancient and often very rudimentary rules were established for humanitarian reasons but rather for purely economic purposes, their effect was humanitarian. The set of laws define, among other things, the right to receive humanitarian assistance, protection of civilians, including medical and humanitarian workers, and the protection of refugees, prisoners, the wounded and sick. While many of the provisions of IHL are now accepted as customary international law, i.e. are considered general practice accepted as law and exist independent of treaty law, IHL is increasingly violated by warring parties.

Today, professional humanitarian workers are in danger if warring factions associate them with military, political, religious and ideological authorities. It is therefore essential that all parties involved respect the distinct and separate roles of humanitarian agencies and workers, comply with international rules, abide by the principles of international humanitarian law and defend humanitarian action. The study of International Humanitarian Law allows students to appreciate the diverse trends unfolding in our World and to respond effectively to theses development. I am extremely happy that my students at SPIL, Mumbai have pledged to study International Law by galvanizing active communication among students and lawyers worldwide, so as to promote this highly specialized arena.

I take this opportunity to congratulate and comment all the committee members of SPIL, Mumbai on their efforts in making this event a success. The leadership and dedication of Mr. Avirup Mandal and Ms. Dikshita Baruah has been exemplary. 



8th Government Law College International Law Summit, 2017

International Humanitarian Law

ver-present unfaltering tension between state sovereignty, security and military considerations on one ⊿hand, and humanitarian considerations on the other have resulted into a highly sensitive enterprise of developing laws to regulate armed conflicts. International humanitarian law, known as the law of armed conflict, is the legal framework which seeks to limit the effects of armed conflict. It aims to restrict the means and methods of warfare and protect persons who are no longer participating in the hostilities. It has been designed in such a way so as to ensure minimal protection even during the most profound catastrophe of human society like war. It is a part of international law, which is contained in agreements between State treaties or conventions, customary rules and general principles. During armed conflict, life finds itself structurally threatened. International Humanitarian Law continues to develop & adapt to the changing realities of conflicts. The combination of providing humanitarian relief in favour of victims of armed conflict and other situations of violence and reaffirming and developing the law applicable in those situations remains one of the main specificities of International Humanitarian Law.

Against the backdrop of appalling violence against civilians across the globe, along with the persistent obstruction of humanitarian aid around the world, the importance of International Humanitarian Law is all the more realised. It has evolved slowly starting with very small humanitarian issues covered in the Hague Convention to protection of civilian population in the Geneva Conventions. It reached a remarkable high in 1977 with the two Additional Protocols. Law frames what must be respected and therefore, protection of civilians and the humanitarian relief to the civilian population and to victims of conflict remains a continuous essential battle. International Humanitarian Law imposes rights and responsibilities on all parties to armed conflict, be the States, non-State armed groups or individuals, the challenge of reducing the gap between law and compliance is magnified by the changing nature of war. The ratio of civilian to combatant casualties in war is steadily growing. Today, the Geneva Conventions and their Additional Protocols are better suited to the protection of human rights in war than ever before but the challenge lies in designing each revision such as to fight the next war.

The fourth Geneva Convention attained universal acceptance. Currently API has 174 and APII has 168 signatories. However, some countries including India refrained from becoming parties to the two Additional Protocols of 1977. The exact reasons for India's non-accession to these treaties have not been spelt out clearly by the government. But it is politically unwise for India to not formally adhere to these provisions because the laws of war aim to serve both. National adherence to the protocol would make insurgents formally liable for their violations of the International Humanitarian Law. It would also assure protection of civilians in an armed conflict of any kind. No state should cite national law or its nonadherence to an international convention as an excuse to derogate from its obligation to protect civilians caught in the cross-fire.

Today, the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) is the only institution explicitly named under International Humanitarian Law as a controlling authority. It is the protector and guardian of International Humanitarian Law. It ensures that application of law is done effectively and therefore respected. The ICRC retains the right to speak for the public and stand for them when the violations are

Despite the legal advancements, insufficient respect for the rules of International Humanitarian Law during armed conflict remains a persistent problem. It is the result of both the lack of political will and practical ability of parties to an armed conflict to comply with their legal obligations. Improving the prevention and repression of International Humanitarian Law violations and better compliance during armed conflicts deserves greater attention. By enhancing the effectiveness of existing mechanisms and examining the potential creation of new ones can strengthen respect for International Humanitarian Law.

novel endeavour, the Judgment Deliberation Competition (JDC) has been inspired by the procedures of various judicial bodies and tribunals that span the spectrum of international law. It brings a fresh approach to problem analysis and judgment making, requiring participants to deliberate upon the analysis of facts presented and arguments advanced, arrive at a unique judgment that is infallible in law, rational in thought, and innovative in its essence.

The Competition Module comprises a case file of a wide connotation, such that it invites varied interpretations that not only attract established legal principles, but also encourage innovation in thought based on legal analysis and rational thinking. The aforementioned Module for the competition consists of a comprehensive set of facts discovered by the judicial authority, tribunal or court, as the case may be; arguments presented by both parties; further evidences, if any, led by them and so forth.

The competition consists of two rounds: first, a Written Judgment Round, and second, Oral Rounds. Each Oral Round comprises the following segments:

Judgment Presentation Round:

Participants present their Judgments

Commenting Round:

Participants make pertinent observations on the points made by their colleagues

Concluding Round:

Participants summarize their judgment and make concluding statements

The Treaty Appreciation Competition

The Treaty Appreciation Competition (TAC) has been modelled on the procedures of various bodies in the international sphere entrusted with the task of evaluating and appraising the legality, consistency and rationality of treaties, codifications or other legislative documents. Participants are expected to launch an examination of the Competition Module presented to them, which comprises of a legislation, or codification, or amendments to the aforementioned, relevant to the theme of the Summit.

The participants critique the proposition therein and recommend alterations, deletions or additions. The Treaty Appreciation Competition (TAC) aims at mobilizing a culture of innovation and problem solving. Previously, bodies such as the International Law Commission and the WTO have been chosen as the forum to facilitate this competition.

The competition consists of two rounds: first, a Written Critique Round and then Oral Rounds. The Oral Rounds of Deliberation are chaired by Special Rapporteurs, who after a brief introduction of the subject in discussion, preside over the sessions, which proceeds along the lines of the Agenda. Each item on the Agenda is allocated a specific period of time and is discussed over two sessions, spread over two days.

Each team comprises of two participants who are assigned a country code upon registration. The team nominates one member for each item on the agenda.

The TAC Module, 2018, has been drafted by Prof. Pavle Kilibarda, Teaching Assistant, Geneva Academy of International Humanitarian Law and Human Rights, Geneva, Switzerland. The Treaty Appreciation Competition, 2018 was judged by Prof. Kishu Daswani and Ms. Sonali Mathur.

Despite not being party to the UNHCR Refugee Convention of 1951 and the Protocol Relating to the Status of Refugees, 1967, history is witness to the fact that India has always opened its doors for refugees and asylum seekers and has set an example for other countries to emulate. However, of late, India's stance on its refugee policy has severely fluctuated in what may be called one of the biggest refugee crises in the world – the Rohingya Crisis. India's position is delicate, owing to the foreign policy on Myanmar and unfortunate experiences of religious fundamentalism and anti-state actions connected therewith. The 1970's saw an influx of refugees from East Pakistan, who were eventually accepted by India on humanitarian grounds received continuity as a policy during the Sri Lankan Tamil exodus as well. Accordingly, we seek to question that "Is India's Refugee Policy a Case of Smoke and Mirrors?" treating the same to be the centrifugal point of the Panel Discussion because it is the need of the hour to deliberate upon whether India needs to enact specific laws and regulations regarding the status of the refugees desiring to seek refuge in the country or is it already obligated by International covenants like that of the Convention on Torture.

It also deals with how late Eisenhower hosted Al Banna (who went on to set up the Muslim Brotherhood, the mother of all Muslim terrorist outfits) at the White House. It also exposes the Oil companies' machinations in the third world. Coming in the wake of 26/11 the book explains how terrorism in its current form today is a by-product of the energy wars.
- 'युद्ध जीवांचे' (*yudhdha jiyanche*) is a chilling story of biological warfare.

She was the main litigant in over 68 criminal cases trying to ensure justice for victims of mass communal crimes, and has created path breaking Jurisprudence while underlying the need for a National Witness Protection Programme, Independent Directorates of Prosecution, Time Bound Trials and Police Reform; Justice for Minorities, Dalits and Women including the Best Bakery Case; Naroda Patiya, Sardarpura, Odh Gulberg Mass Massacre Trials; Class Action on Compensation; Case Related to Hate Speech in Gujarat and Maharashtra; Class Action for Compensation and Reparation. Setalvad was on the Drafting Committee of the Indian Government's National Advisory Council (NAC) that submitted a Draft Law for the Prevention of Communal and Targeted Violence (2011).

Teesta Setalvad as the chief functionary of the organization, Citizens for Justice and Peace (CJP) has, collectively with her dedicated team including lawyers ensured that over 122 powerful perpetrators of the Gujarat carnage of 2002 are convicted to life imprisonment. CJP continues to ensure that the victories elicited in the Special Courts monitored by the Supreme Court of India are retained. CIP continues with its legal aid support to Victim Survivors in the appeals filed in the higher Courts.

She has won several laurels including the Padmasri, Wockhardt Foundation Human Rights Popular Awards, Justice V.R. Krishna Iyer Centenary Award - 2015 for Social Justice and Human Rights Crusade, Mes Excellence Award, Bi Amma Award for Outstanding Contribution in Public Life, Jan Mitra Award, Pride of India Award and many more. She is currently in the process of designing and activating a Prevention of Violence/Peace Map Mechanism that will attempt to create a nationwide cadre of peace activists that will document the signals of the build-up of communal, hate driven violence in various parts of India.

The World Trade Organization — the WTO — is the international organization whose primary purpose is to open trade for the benefit of all.

The WTO provides a forum for negotiating agreements aimed at reducing obstacles to international trade and ensuring a level playing field for all, thus contributing to economic growth and development. The WTO also provides a legal and institutional framework for the implementation and monitoring of these agreements, as well as for settling disputes arising from their interpretation and application. The current body of trade agreements comprising the WTO consists of 16 different multilateral agreements (to which all WTO members are parties) and two different plurilateral agreements (to which only some WTO members are parties).

Over the past 60 years, the WTO, which was established in 1995, and its predecessor organization the GATT have helped to create a strong and prosperous international trading system, thereby contributing to unprecedented global economic growth. The WTO currently has 164 members, of which 117 are developing countries or separate customs territories. WTO activities are supported by a Secretariat of some 700 staff, led by the WTO Director-General. The Secretariat is located in Geneva, Switzerland, and has an annual budget of approximately CHF 200 million (\$180 million, €130 million). The three official languages of the WTO are English, French and Spanish.

Decisions in the WTO are generally taken by consensus of the entire membership. The highest institutional body is the Ministerial Conference, which meets roughly every two years. A General Council conducts the organization's business in the intervals between Ministerial Conferences. Both of these bodies comprise all members. Specialised subsidiary bodies (Councils, Committees, Sub-committees), also comprising all members, administer and monitor the implementation by members of the various WTO agreements. More specifically, the WTO's main activities are:

- Negotiating the reduction or elimination of obstacles to trade (import tariffs, other barriers to trade) and agreeing on rules governing the conduct of international trade (e.g. antidumping, subsidies, product standards, etc.)
- Administering and monitoring the application of the WTO's agreed rules for trade in goods, trade in services, and trade-related intellectual property rights
- Monitoring and reviewing the trade policies of our members, as well as ensuring transparency of regional and bilateral trade agreements
- Settling disputes among our members regarding the interpretation and application of the agreements
- Building capacity of developing country government officials in international trade matters
- Assisting the process of accession of some 30 countries who are not yet members of the organization
- Conducting economic research and collecting and disseminating trade data in support of the WTO's other main activities
- Explaining to and educating the public about the WTO, its mission and its activities.

The WTO's founding and guiding principles remain the pursuit of open borders, the guarantee of most-favoured-nation principle and non-discriminatory treatment by and among members, and a commitment to transparency in the conduct of its activities. The opening of national markets to international trade, with justifiable exceptions or with adequate flexibilities, will encourage and contribute to sustainable development, raise people's welfare, reduce poverty, and foster peace and stability. At the same time, such market opening must be accompanied by sound domestic and international policies that contribute to economic growth and development according to each member's needs and aspirations.
